THE METAPHOR OF GRASSHOPPERS

GRASSHOPPERS, IN ROY'S NARRATIVE, REPRESENT THE SMALL, SEEMINGLY INSIGNIFICANT ELEMENTS IN A VAST DEMOCRATIC SYSTEM—MINORITIES, DISSENTERS, THE POOR, AND THE OPPRESSED. THESE ARE THE PEOPLE WHOSE STORIES OFTEN GO UNHEARD AMIDST THE OVERWHELMING NOISE OF POLITICAL RHETORIC AND MEDIA SPECTACLE. BY "LISTENING" TO THESE GRASSHOPPERS, ROY URGES READERS AND CITIZENS TO PAY ATTENTION TO THE SUBTLE YET CRUCIAL SIGNS OF DEMOCRATIC DECAY. IT'S A CALL TO RECOGNIZE THAT DEMOCRACY ISN'T JUST ABOUT ELECTIONS AND LAWS BUT ABOUT NURTURING THE VOICES THAT TYPICALLY GET DROWNED OUT.

FIELD NOTES ON DEMOCRACY: THE STATE OF INDIAN DEMOCRACY TODAY

ROY'S FIELD NOTES ARE GROUNDED IN ACUTE OBSERVATIONS OF INDIA'S EVOLVING POLITICAL LANDSCAPE. HER CRITIQUE IS NOT JUST ABOUT INDIA BUT ALSO RESONATES GLOBALLY, AS DEMOCRACIES EVERYWHERE FACE SIMILAR CHALLENGES—RISING AUTHORITARIANISM, SUPPRESSION OF DISSENT, AND THE CURTAILING OF CIVIL LIBERTIES.

EMPATHY TOWARDS MARGINALIZED VOICES

ACTIVE PARTICIPATION BEYOND VOTING

- **EDUCATE YOURSELF AND OTHERS:** LEARN ABOUT DEMOCRATIC RIGHTS AND PROCESSES, AND SHARE THIS KNOWLEDGE WITHIN YOUR NETWORKS.
- **PRACTICE CRITICAL THINKING:** QUESTION NARRATIVES PRESENTED BY MAINSTREAM MEDIA AND POLITICAL FIGURES; SEEK MULTIPLE SOURCES BEFORE FORMING OPINIONS.
