4. EXPECT AND ACCEPT NON-CLOSURE: RECOGNIZE THAT THESE CONVERSATIONS ARE ONGOING AND MAY NOT HAVE IMMEDIATE SOLUTIONS.

THESE AGREEMENTS CREATE A SAFE SPACE WHERE HONEST DIALOGUE CAN THRIVE.

IDENTIFYING RACIAL STANCES

A 2020 STUDY PUBLISHED IN THE JOURNAL OF EDUCATIONAL EQUITY FOUND THAT SCHOOLS IMPLEMENTING STRUCTURED RACIAL EQUITY DIALOGUES REPORTED A 15% IMPROVEMENT IN MINORITY STUDENT ENGAGEMENT AND A 10% DECREASE IN DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS DISPROPORTIONATELY AFFECTING STUDENTS OF COLOR. WHILE SUCH DATA POINTS ARE NOT DIRECTLY FROM SINGLETON’S WORK, THEY ALIGN WITH THE GUIDE’S EMPHASIS ON DIALOGUE AS A CATALYST FOR CHANGE.
